INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY



BOSCO Yuvakendra organized International Yoga Day for the youth at the centre, on June 21, 2021. Bro. Naveen, BOSCO Yuvakendra, explained about the importance, benefits and advantages of practicing yoga on a daily basis, especially during the COVID-19 pandemic. The youth were told that yoga could be considered as a disciplined method of attaining a goal, and a method for mastering body and mind. They were taught a few simple yet effective asanas. The youth learnt about the physical and mental benefits of yoga such as increased flexibility, strength, stamina, and improved body alignment, also stress reduction, body awareness, better sleep balance, relaxation, and improved self-confidence. Twenty-two youths attended the session.

ADOLESCENT GIRLS' MEETINGS

BOSCO Nilaya organized a meeting for adolescent girls, at the centre, on April 6, 2021. Bhagyalakshmi, Social Activist, BOSCO Nilaya, started the session by explaining the importance of reading and personal hygiene. She gave awareness about COVID-19. The girls were motivated to maintain personal hygiene, and were asked to take advice from their parents. Goal setting was explained. The girls were asked to set an aim and work towards it. Ms. Bindu, Social Activitist, BOSCO Nilaya, showing a motivational video explained about developing mental strength. Nine girls participated in the meeting.

BOSCO Nivas conducted the Adolescent Girls' Meeting at Ambedkar Huts on April 23, 2021. The main objective of the programme was to create awareness among girls about Good touch and Bad touch. Priya, Team Member, BOSCO Nivas, conducted the session and explained to the children about the difference between good touch and bad touch and how to take care of themselves. Ten girls attended the session.





CARING COMMUNITY MEETING



BOSCO Nivas organized Caring Community Meeting for the stakeholders, at the centre, on April 10, 2021. The main objective of the meeting was to discuss the problem of child labour in the Beef market, Russell Market, Fish market areas, and road side shops near the church, and ask the support of the Labour Union Leaders of markets under Shivajinagar and place before them the issue of child labour in the vicinity. The members were invited to play an active role and join BOSCO in fighting the menace of child labour. Mr. Parwez, Caring Community Member, said that it would be appreciated if they could get an identity card so that it would be easy to carry out the operations. Four members participated in the meeting.

STATE LEVEL MONITORING MEETING



BOSCO Foster Care Programme organized the State Level Monitoring Meeting of the Foster Care Project at BOSCO Yuvodaya on April 9 and 10, 2021. During the inauguration, Sr. Juliet, Member, CWC - 3, appreciated the organizers and said that this was a unique programme of providing alternative family care for children without families. Fr. Rubin Mathew, Director, BREADS, Bengaluru, stressed the need for measuring the impact of the programme so that it could be taken to all the districts of the state. Speaking on the occasion, Fr. Mathew Thomas, Executive Director, BOSCO Bengaluru, thanked all the NGO partners for taking the Foster Care Programme forward and joining hands with BOSCO in its endeavour to provide alternative family care for needy children. Ms. Shobha, Superintendent, Integrated Child Protection Scheme, Karnataka, shared the statistics of children placed in foster care in the state. She also briefed everyone about the challenges faced in identifying foster parents and placing the children in foster care as it is a temporary arrangement for the children. Fr. Joy, Executive Director, BREADS, Bengaluru, suggested a few points to take the programme forward.

Foster Care posters were released on the occasion. Dr. Usha Kiran, Ph.D. Scholar and Psychiatric Social Worker, presented the roles and responsibilities of the different stakeholders in Foster Care. Fr. Varghese Pallipuram, Director, Foster Care Programme, BOSCO Bengaluru, spoke about how to 'Monitor and Maintain Records' in Foster Care. Mr. Shivamallu, State Coordinator, Foster Care Programme, presented the statistical data and budget report of Districts for 9 months. Social Mobilizers presented the report of their respective districts.

Ramaswamy, Outreach Officer, BOSCO Foster Care Programme, welcomed the gathering, and Nandini, Asst. Coordinator, BOSCO Foster Care Programme, proposed the vote of thanks. Twenty participants from ten districts of Karnataka along with BOSCO staff were present in the meeting.

AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS



Awareness Campaign was organized by the BOSCO Nilaya team for the public and shopkeepers at Avenue Road, Bengaluru, on April 8, 2021. Members of the public and shopkeepers were given awareness on Child Rights, Child Rights Violation, CHILDLINE, and Vocational Skill Training courses at BOSCO. Shopkeepers and vendors took the initiative of passing on the information to the public. Two youths expressed interest in joining skill training. One child needed hostel facility. Follow-up is being done. Around 300 members of the public were given awareness.

PUBLIC AWARENESS AT AVENUE ROAD | AWARENESS CAMPAIGNS ORGANIZED



BOSCO Nivas organized awareness campaigns in the communities and public areas of Nehrupuram and Ambedkar Huts of Shivajinagar, Bengaluru, on April 16 and 21, 2021. The team went around public places, shops, streets, and households, distributing handbills containing information about the vocational training



courses in BOSCO, child related information, CHILDLINE, and the dangers faced by children on the streets of Bengaluru. The team sought the support of the public and stakeholders in identifying and rescuing children in difficult situations. Information on COVID-19 protocol and the precautions to be taken was also disseminated. Three hundred members of the public, auto drivers, street vendors, shopkeepers, and households were reached through these campaigns.

AWARENESS ON SOCIAL ENTITLEMENTS

BOSCO Nilaya organized a programme to create awareness about the existing Government schemes for the welfare of people, at JC Road, Bengaluru, on April 21, 2021. Fr. Regi Jacob, Director, BOSCO Nilaya, briefed everyone about BOSCO and its activities. He also explained the procedures for applying for loans. Thirteen women participated in the programme.

They also explained about the follow-up process once the children are handed over to the parents. The support required during the rescue process was also briefed. Around forty drivers and thirty-seven shopkeepers benefited from the awareness programmes.

ORIENTATION FOR NEW STAFF

Railway CHILDLINE, explained about the rescue process, CWC, and home placement of children. Mr. Anjaneya, Coordinator, Bus Stand Team, explained about accompanied and unaccompanied children. Mr. Prashanth Murthy, HR Manager, BOSCO Bengaluru, explained about the Child Protection Policy and HR Policy. Eight new staff members attended the orientation programme.

FOSTER CARE TRAINING PROGRAMMES



BOSCO Foster Care Project organized online training sessions for Anganwadi teachers of Deepanjali Nagar and Anekal Circle, Primary School Teachers of Aralepete, Chamarajpet, and Asha Workers of Chandapura, during the last week of April 2021 and first week of May 2021. Obalesh, Social Mobilizer, BOSCO Foster Care Project, briefed



everyone about BOSCO services, CHILDLINE toll free number-1098, adoption process, foster care concept, role of DCPU, and Child Welfare Committee. Fifty-five Anganwadi teachers, twelve Primary school teachers, and four Asha workers attended the online training.

INDUCTION TRAINING ORGANIZED

Sr. Susan, Coordinator, Health Care Department, spoke about medication and first She said that first aid is an immediate treatment that is given to a person during an emergency. She also explained about minor illnesses and the general medicines for them. Clinical thermometer, tablets, and ointments and their names were explained. Usage of cotton, bandage, and surgical scissors were shown, and methods to use them were also demonstrated.

Orientation session for the SSLC students of BOSCO Vikas who are preparing for the upcoming SSLC exams was done on June 16, 2021. Fr. Prasad, Director, BOSCO Mane and Vikas, facilitated the session. He also spoke about the necessity of having the right attitude, confidence, courage, and hope to face the exams, thereby overcoming the fear of exams. LIFE SKILL SESSION ON TEAM BUILDING



Life skill session on 'Team building' was conducted for the youths of BOSCO Life Skill Training Centre, Sumanahalli, on April 03, 2021. The session conducted by Ms. Charlene D' Souza, Centre Coordinator, included games and activities to learn about the meaning and importance of team building, and to help the participants focus on the importance of communication and coordination in team building. In order to make the group aware that communication and coordination are important in a group, 'minefield' game was introduced where the group worked together to get through the obstacles on the floor. Fifteen youths participated in the session.

LIFE SKILL SESSION ON TEAM WORK

BOSCO Rainbow Home organized a life skill session on 'Team Work', for the residents of the centre on April 21, 2021. Sr. Mary Shamala, Counselor, BOSCO Rainbow Home, showed short video clippings on team work. She also conducted various games and activities which helped the girls hone social skills such as patience, empathy, communication, respect for others, compromise, and tolerance. The session also helped them develop self-confidence, and trust in other people to work as a team. Nineteen girls participated in the session.



LIFE SKILL SESSION



A one-day life skill session was organized for the youth of BOSCO Yuvakendra, at the centre, on April 14, 2021. The Facilitator, Vinod Kumar, started the session by sharing the life story of APJ Abdul Kalam, Cristiano Ronaldo, football player, and Usain Bolt, athlete. Activities like Wheel of Life, Self-care, and Beautiful You were conducted. Later, party games like Tom and Jerry, Onion with Nose, Train Game, and Newspaper Fashion Show and Dance were organized. These activities served as an opportunity for the young people to reflect on their positive qualities, develop self-esteem, work in a team, share and listen, try new things, manage time, etc. Twenty youths participated in the life skill session.

LIFE SKILL TRAINING

BOSCO Rainbow Home conducted a life skill training session on the 'Importance of Making Connections', for the children of the centre, on June 25, 2021. The purpose of the session was to make them understand that connections help them describe how things are related to each other, how the physical world works, and to guide them to expand their thinking by making connections, which is a core component of creativity. Sr. Mary Shamala, Counselor, BOSCO Rainbow Home, divided the children into groups of three and asked them to speak about any object and its flow of connections. Every group came up with various topics like television, parts of the body, electricity, tree, sickness, human feelings, telephone, nature, etc. The activity helped the children to sort out and categorize objects and the way they are connected. Eighteen girls participated in the session.



VALUE EDUCATION

VALUE EDUCATION ON GENEROSITY



Value education session on 'Generosity', was organized for the children at the centre, by BOSCO Rainbow Home, on April 20, 2021. Sr. Mary Shamala, Counselor, **BOSCO** Rainbow Home, conducted the session with the purpose of empowering the girls to be generous in their attitude to others, to think of others, to listen to others, share with others, value others, and to give to others. A short film on generosity was screened. The session inspired the girls to practise good qualities like patience, love, kindness, and compassion towards others. Twenty-six children attended the session.

VALUE EDUCATION SESSION



Value Education session on 'Respecting People and Things', was organized by BOSCO Rainbow Home, for the children of the centre, on June 26, 2021. The session was facilitated by Sr. Mary Shamala, Counselor, BOSCO Rainbow Home. She explained to the children the importance of respecting people and things around them and knowing their value. She said that everyone in the world has the right to live with respect and dignity, including self. She also emphasized on knowing one's worth and honoring the worth of others. An inspirational movie was shown to make the children understand the difficulties that parents face in educating their children. Eighteen girls attended the session.

HEALTH CAMPS

GENERAL HEALTH CHECK-UP





BOSCO Yuvakendra conducted a general health checkup for the youths at the centre in coordination with the BOSCO Health Department, on April 29, 2021, and BOSCO Mane, Vikas, and Yuvodaya, conducted health checkups on June 24 and 26, 2021, in their respective centres. A team from St. Martha's Hospital headed by Dr. Abraham conducted the camp. They did eye, ear, nose, throat, height, weight, and general health check of the children present in the centres. Medicines were given as per prescriptions. The team advised all the children to keep themselves hydrated, do regular exercises, and have nutritious food. Dr. Abraham spoke about health and hygiene. He also stressed the need for maintaining personal hygiene. He gave awareness on COVID-19 and asked the youth/children not to panic unnecessarily. Two youths from Yuvakendra who are under NIMHANS treatment were prescribed medicines. Twenty-one youths from Yuvakendra, seventy-four children from BOSCO Mane, Vikas, and Yuvodaya, and nine staff members benefited from the health check-up.

TALENT SHOW ORGANIZED

BOSCO Yuvodaya organized a Talent Show for the children of Annamma Colony, Gandhinagar, Bengaluru, to mark the celebrations of Ambedkar Jayanthi, on April 17, 2021. Mathew Thomas, Executive Director, BOSCO Bengaluru, exhorted the older children of the community to take the responsibility of educating the smaller children during the trying times of the COVID-19 pandemic.
