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Christmas Celebrations



Survey and Ration Kit distribution



CHILDLINE Collab, BOSCO Bengaluru conducted a survey at the RR Nagar community, near Legacy Apartments, Bengaluru, and identified 79 children, 30 families, and 12 children, and 5 families at Bytarayanapura Community, on December 11, 2021. Thirty ration kits were distributed to 30 families at RR Nagar Community and 5 Ration kits were distributed to 5 families at Bytarayanapura Community. These families are basically from the Gulbarga, Raichur, and Yadgir districts of Karnataka. Most of the parents are working at construction sites. The children attend Government School at Bangarappangudda, Shri Guru Shanthanada School, Nayandahalli, and Government School Bytarayanapura. All families live in shacks made of tarpaulin and sheets.

Value Education on Patience



BOSCO Rainbow Home organized a value education session on 'Patience' to the resident girls of the centre on December 28, 2021, to enable children to analyze things and situations beyond their face value and also to help them have inner peace and the ability to keep smiling despite challenges. Sr. Mary Shamala, Counselor, BOSCO Rainbow Home facilitated the session by narrating a moral story on patience, showing a motivational movie, and giving some tips to reduce their anger and handle things with kindness and patience. Twenty-four girls took part in the session.

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Health Awareness Programme

A health awareness program was conducted for the BOSCO Rainbow Home children by Dr. Uma Roy and her team, St. Martha's Hospital, Bengaluru on December 20, 2021. Dr. Uma Roy explained to the children about the various types of Virus-Covid-19, Omicron, Black fungus, Delta plus variant. The typical symptoms of the virus include fever, chills, cough, shortness of breath, muscle or body ache, headache, sore throat, pain in the throat, tiredness, loss of taste or smell, uncomfortable feeling, and clogged nose or doses of vaccines, maintain social distancing and runny nose.

She explained the precautionary steps to be taken to remain safe. She said that it is essential to wear a mask properly, regular hand wash, gargle, sanitize, take both



maintain good ventilation. The resource team put up awareness skit, dance, songs, and games to explain the concept. Forty children were part of the awareness programme.
