Mr. Shivamallu, Coordinator, BOSCO Foster Care Program started the session with the meaning of Foster care and the reasons for implementing foster care as an alternative family care for the children.

Akshitha, Social Mobiliser, Foster Care Program, explained about child rights, foster care concept, types of foster care, selection criteria of parents & children, rights of children in foster family, responsibilities of foster parents, different levels of awareness programs, case study file of parents & children, placement of children and follow up of children.

Awareness materials were distributed to the Directors representing their NGOs. Forty-one NGO participants representing ten districts of Karnataka attended the consultation.
