Health Camp at Mackan Compound



An outreach Health Camp for the students of Nava Bahar Shah School and residents of Mackan Compound was conducted in the premises of the school, by Dr. Abraham and team from St. Martha Hospital, Bangalore, in collaboration with BOSCO Health Care Department on July 13, 2018.

Services provided were medical tests for blood sugar, blood pressure, suspected Tuberculosis, cardiac cases, and vision impairments. Majority of people who attended the camp availed the Diabetic and Optical examination facilities. Several cases of diabetics were identified during the camp. It was observed that many of the children were suffering from visual impairment related issues. Patients suspected to be suffering from Tuberculosis were asked to produce sputum samples to the closest BBMP Hospital for medical examination. Seventyone students and seventy-two residents benefitted from the camp.

Health Camp at KR Market

BOSCO Nilaya organized a health camp in collaboration with BOSCO Health Care Department and Community Health Department, St. Martha's Hospital, Bangalore at BBMP Office, K.R. Market Complex, Bangalore, on July 6, 2018. Eye checkup, B.P, Diabetics tests was conducted for all. Medicines were prescribed. Few medicines were given to the ailing, for free.

Fifteen people with Cataract disease were referred to Minto Hospital for further treatment, five Blood Pressure cases, ten cases of anemia, nine cases with respiratory symptoms and twenty-four diabetic cases were referred to Jayadeva Hospital, H.Siddaiah Referral Hospital, Victoria Hospital and St. Marta's Hospital for further treatment.

Health Inspector appreciated BOSCO and suggested conducting training for BBMP workers and other stake holders on First aid. Hundred and sixty -five people availed the services of the camp. Dr. Selvaraj Abraham, Dr. Cathrin, Dr. Lithi, Uma Raj, Social worker, Ms. Shabina, Assistant coordinator, BOSCO Health department conducted the camp.
