#### Awareness at Schools

In the Month of July CHILDLINE Collab, BOSCO Bengaluru conducted twelve School Awareness Programmes. The team was given awareness about Child rights and CHILDLINE 1098, POCSO, Safe touch, and unsafe touch. The team distributed pamphlets and explained the project. KOMAL Movie was screened. Around 1100 students and over 30 teachers benefited from the programs.



Awareness at Health Centres



CHILDLINE collab BOSCO Bengaluru conducted Health center awareness at Primary health center Yarab Nagar, Primary health center Gottigere. They were given awareness about CHILDLINE and child rights. Around 24 hospital staff and 40 General public benefited from the program.

#### Public awareness
