Earth Day Celebrations



World Earth Day was celebrated in BOSCO Yuvodaya on April 22, 2023. The session started with a short prayer thanking Mother Earth. The ses-

sion began with an explanation about the importance of celebrating World Earth Day by Vinnarasi, Team Member, BOSCO Yuvodaya. Fr. Johnson, Director, BOSCO Yuvodaya explained about God's creations in nature which give happiness, love, and peace to others, and how the planet has to be protected. He spoke about the importance of saving water and electricity, conserving wildlife, saying no to plastic, planting more trees, saving trees, and recycling. The children were asked to draw a picture of the earth. Twenty-eight children of the open shelter were part of the celebration.

Meeting of Prospective Foster Care Parents

Foster Care Programme, BOSCO Bengaluru, organized a meeting with prospective parents at BOSCO Mane on April 25, 2023. Obalesh K, Social Mobilizer, BOSCO Foster Care Programme, introduced the purpose of the meeting. Briefing about BOSCO and its services Fr. Varghese Pallipuram, Executive Director, BOSCO Bengaluru, said that the Foster Care project was born out of the belief that family is the best place for a child to grow up in. The vision was to give children without families a chance to experience and grow up in a family. He said that BOSCO has become a model for the state of Karnataka.

Ganesh Murthy, PO(NIC), DCPU Bengaluru South, explained the procedures to be followed in applying for fostering a child and also the follow-up thereby. Soumya, PO(NIC), DCPU Bengaluru North briefed about the five District Child Protection Units in Bengaluru and the units that the parents need to visit in



order to give their applications.

Shivamallu, State Coordinator, BOSCO Foster Care Programme, explained the concept of foster care, eligibility to become a care provider under foster care, children who are eligible for placements, rights of children and foster parents in foster families, the procedure involved in becoming foster parents, required documents, legal framework and roles of authorities such as CWC members. Twenty-three prospective parents participated in the meeting.

Awareness to Stakeholders



Child Safety Net (CSN) Project, BOSCO Bengaluru organized awareness programmes for the Traffic Police, Police Officials, and BBMP staff – Sweepers and Supervisors, and Anganwadi teachers in their locations of intervention, during April 2023. PN Basavaraju, Coordinator, CSN Project introduced BOSCO, its programmes, and services for the welfare of the children. He spoke about the steps to be taken to make Bengaluru a child-friendly city. He requested the support of the stakeholders in identifying children employed, children in difficult situations, and children in conflict with the law so that every child may be safe and happy. Hundred and twenty traffic police, police officials, BBMP workers, supervisors, and Anganwadi teachers attended the sessions.

Health Camp at BOSCO Mane



Health Care Department, BOSCO Bengaluru organized a health camp at BOSCO Mane for the boys of the centre on April 29, 2023. Dr. Abraham, St. Martha's Hospital, Bengaluru did the general check-up of the children of Mane and Vikas. He referred seven boys with dental caries to the dentist, one boy to the cardiologist, one boy to an ophthalmologist, and six boys suffering from skin problems to a dermatologist. He observed that children's diets should include foods rich in protein. Overall, the general health condition of the boys was good. Seventy-two boys from BOSCO Mane and Vikas benefited from the health camp.

Parents Meeting Organized at BOSCO Mane



BOSCO Vikas and Mane organized a meeting for the parents of the school-going children at the centre on April 1, 2023. Mr. Papaiah, Coordinator, BOSCO Vikas, briefed the gathering about the summer vacation. He asked the parents to take good care of the children at home by engaging them in meaningful and productive activities. He also asked the parents to take care

of their food and nutrition. Savitha and Sujatha, Coordinator and Counselor, BOSCO Mane, spoke about documents to be submitted, like parents' Aadhaar cards, child's Aadhaar card, ration cards, caste certificates, religious documents, and pan cards necessary for availing the benefits of the Government schemes. The staff gave awareness of drug abuse and its ill effects.

Fr. Prasad SDB, Director, BOSCO Mane, exhorted the parents to help their wards learn self-discipline and asked them to send the children back to the centre after the vacation promptly. He shared about the summer camp being organized for the children after they come back from vacation. Fifty parents and guardians attended the meeting.

Cancer Detection Camp



BOSCO Health Care Project in coordination with BOSCO Nilaya organized a Cancer Awareness and Detection Camp for the people in the community residing near the centre, on April 15, 2023. Dr. Ranga Nayaki, Gynaecologic Oncologist, Dr. Javeria, Breast Surgeon, and Dr. Guru Suhas, Otolaryngologist, Vijayakumar, Coordinator, three nurses and two MSW Social Workers from Indian Cancer Society, Bengaluru, conducted the camp.

The doctors checked the weight, BP, and sugar of the attendees of the camp and conducted the tests for screening for cervical, oral, and breast cancer. The team also gave awareness about cancer, various types of cancer, their detection, and treatment. A few were prescribed medicines based on their illnesses. Around ninety people from the surrounding communities of BOSCO Nilaya availed the services of the camp.

Foster Care Awareness



Foster Care awareness programmes were organized for the anganwadi mothers of Kamasandra Anganwadi Centre and R Colony Anganwadi Centre by BOSCO Foster Care Programme on April 17 and 18, 2023. The awareness programmes were organized in order to disseminate information about the foster care concept, adoption, the procedures involved in foster care and adoption, the various stakeholders involved in the programme and their roles and responsibilities. Obalesh, Social Mobilizer, BOSCO Foster Care Programme conducted the awareness programmes and he requested the anganwadi mothers to pass on the information to their families, friends and the community people and also help BOSCO in identifying potential parents and children for the foster care programme. Twenty-seven anganwadi mothers were a part of these programmes.

Karate Belt Grading Exam

BOSCO Life Skill Training Centre, Sumanahalli organized the karate belt grading exam for the trainees of the centre, to assess their learning levels and to award the Yellow Belt for the trainees so that they are promoted to the next stage of training on April 2, 2023. Mr. Ningappa and the team trained the boys for about two and a half hours. Mr. Maralinga, Karate Instructor addressed the trainees and said that there is a long way for the trainees to go in learning karate. He said that karate is a self-defence technique. It helps in developing self-discipline. Fr. Joshy, Director, BOSCO Life Skill Training Centre said that self-discipline and punctuality are very much essential for the trainees to



accomplish the skills. Four trainees were awarded gold medals and a certificate for their good performance. Seventeen trainees underwent the training.

Public Awareness Programmes



BOSCO teams working in BMTC and KSRTC bus stand, Adjacent Railway Street Presence (ARSP) project, BOSCO Nilaya and Nivas conducted awareness for the public, passengers and commuters, shopkeepers, in the bus stands, railway stations, and market areas during April 2023. The teams reached out to the public by way of distributing pamphlets containing information on child rights, child-related laws, and acts, and issues such as child labour, child marriage, child trafficking, child begging, missing children, child runaways, vulnerable children, and child helpline-1098. Around nine hundred and fifty passengers, commuters, shopkeepers, and other public benefitted from the awareness.

Stakeholders Meeting



BOSCO Nilaya in coordination with the BOSCO SJPJ project team met the police officials at Kalasipalya Police Station, Bengaluru on April 13, 2023. The purpose of the visit was to introduce the Nilaya team to the police personnel and develop a rapport with them so that they support the team in its rescue and rehabilitation activities. Fr. Jude Anand SDB, Director, BOSCO Nilaya, and Ramaswamy, Coordinator, SJPJ project introduced the BOSCO Nilaya team to the police officials. They briefed about BOSCO and its activities and sought the help of the police in the activities of BOSCO Nilaya and in creating a child-friendly police station. Ms. Preeti, Police Officer, Kalasipalya Police Station, was happy to meet the team and know about the activities of BOSCO. She ensured support to the team whenever required. Fourteen Police Officials, BOSCO Nilaya, and the SJPJ team were present at the meeting.

Planning and Monitoring Meeting

Foster Care, BOSCO Bengaluru, organized a Planning and Monitoring meeting for Social Mobilizers and NGO Supporting Staff at Don Bosco, Hospet, on April 27, 2023. The programme started with the prayer song by DB Tech students followed by watering the plant. Mr. Raghavendra, Former Member, KSCPCR explained in detail the role of CWC, DCPO, NGOs, foster care concept, criteria for selection, legal procedures, etc. Fr. Varghese Pallipuram, Executive Director, BOSCO Bengaluru, appreciated the Bellary District Unit for being the role model for other districts for the implementation of the foster care programme. He said that BOSCO had placed a total of twenty-six children in foster care in the ten districts of Karnataka. He also thanked the officials of the department, DCPU, CWC and the project partners for the support extended in implementing the programme.

Ms. Vijayalakshmi, Chairperson, CWC, Bellary and Vijayanagar, Ms. Subhadra Devi, CDPO, Vijayanagar, Mr. Channabasappa Patil, PO (NIC), and Fr. Roshan, Executive Director, Don Bosco, Hospet spoke on the occasion. Mr. Shivamallu, State Coordinator, BOSCO Foster Care Program, presented the statistical data



and placement of children during the period. Social Mobilizers presented the challenges and achievements of the foster care programme implemented in the ten districts of Karnataka. There was a discussion on taking the programme forward in the ten districts of Karnataka.

Mr. Shivamallu welcomed the participants, and Mr. Ganesh, Social Mobilizer, Don Bosco Bellary proposed the vote of thanks. Mr. Manjunath and Ms. Kalavathi, Members, CWC were also present in the meeting. Around thirty members from ten districts participated in the meeting.

Exposure Visit to Lakme Salon



The trainees of the Beautician course at BOSCO Vatsalya Bhavan were taken to Lakme Salon, Frazer Town, Bengaluru on April 13, 2023. Ms. Roopa and the Lakme Salon staff gave advice on the various products used at the Lakme parlour, particularly skin-related products, and demonstrated the various procedures used in the parlour.

Trainees were educated about self-grooming and other topics. Twenty trainees were part of this exposure visit.

Session on Problem-Solving



A life skill session on 'problem-solving' was conducted for the trainees of BOSCO Life Skill Training Centre, Sumanahalli on April 22, 2023. Bro. Lijo captured the attention of the group with a song from where they were asked to pick up words, phrases, etc., that touched them. He spoke about the importance of getting help and guidance from others in achieving success in life. He also shared the importance of teamwork in solving the problem. Twenty trainees benefitted from the session.

Ambedkar Jayanthi Celebrations



BOSCO Yuvakendra and BOSCO Life Skill Training Centre, Sumanahalli celebrated Ambedkar Jayanthi to commemorate the birthday of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar at their respective centres on April 14, 2023. The cele-
