#### Health Camp at BOSCO Centres

The camp was conducted by Dr. Abraham, St. Martha's Hospital, Bengaluru. The height, weight, and temperature levels of the boys were checked. Ten boys needed dental check-ups. Six boys had skin infections and were prescribed medicines. One boy was referred for a psychiatric opinion. A few boys were given medication for colds, coughs, etc. Twenty-five boys attended the camp.

BOSCO Vatsalya Bhavan organized the health camp in coordination with the Health Care Department of BOSCO at the centre on July 15, 2023. Dr. Abraham, St. Martha's Hospital, Bengaluru, conducted the camp. The children's height and weight were measured and a general examination was performed. The doctor advised the staff to include more green vegetables in the food given to the children as well as vitamin and iron tablets/syrup, as all the children require them. Sixty-two girls benefitted from the camp.



A general health check-up camp was organized in BOSCO Yuvodaya by the BOSCO Health Care Department in association with St. Martha's Hospital on July 17, 2023. Dr. Abraham, St. Martha's Hospital, Bengaluru checked the height, weight, temperature, oxygen levels, BP, etc. of the children in the centre. Forty-five availed the services of the camp.

## **Orientation for Tuition Teachers**

The session started with a leadership game - doing threadwork blindfolded. Fr. Uday SDB, Youth Director illustrated how some of the elements can soften and delicately combine with other ingredients. Potatoes, eggs, and coffee seeds were used for illustration. Some people are quite harsh and nasty in the beginning, but as they develop positive character traits, they eventually learn to be kind and modest toward others. Through PPT he explained the leadership goals; leadership theories, leadership styles, leadership qualities, leadership challenges, and how to be an effective leader. Nineteen girls benefitted from the session.

# Learning to Let Go of a Painful Past!



I don't want to beg; I want to study; that was the plea of 11-year-old Seema (Name Changed) who was found begging at the KSR railway station in Majestic. A native of Kurnool district in Andhra Pradesh, Seema was born to an alcoholic father and a mother. Seema's father used to work as a bus driver, but slowly the alcohol he was addicted to took over his job, his marriage, and his family. Tired of fighting a losing battle, Seema's mother decided to end the problem once and for all and left the house. Seema's mother remarried and her new husband resorted to begging for a living.

Seema's stepfather did not go for any other work. His to finding her identiwhole livelihood and income were based on begging. Seema's mother who previously used to work as a domestic worker decided to give it up after her second marriage. Soon, Seema too was forced to beg along with her parents. All three of them would beg during the day and spend the night in the market on the street. Once while begging, Seema was spotted by a traffic policeman and taken to the CWC from BVB staff contacted where she was sent to the Peddapadu Girls Home in the district of Kurnool. Seema studied there till the 3rd standard after which her parents stopped her education, took her out of the hostel, and brought her to Bengaluru with them.

Seema had vivid accounts to recount of long days spent among the changing faces at crowded signals and public places carrying the chewing tobacco her father would give her to sell. One day while selling her merchandise in the Majestic railway station she was spotted and rescued by BOSCO. Seema's parents were not with her when she was rescued, and weeks after bringing her to BOSCO Vatsalya Bhavan on the 27th of January, 2023, for shelter, they were still not with her.

While efforts were being made to find Seema's parents on the one hand, all that Seema was able to say was a few place names in Andhra Pradesh that seemed to have had some significance in her life. She initially mentioned the name of Kotipi near Hin-

dupur in Andhra

Pradesh, but after contacting the CHILDLINE and police station there, Vatsalya Bhavan staff were no closer ty. Many days later, Seema happened to Kurnool mention and Peddistrict dapadu hostel in one of her conversations with the counsellor. the Kurnool CWC and the child was



identified as one of the previous residents of the Girls' Home in Peddapadu. She was taken to Kurnool on the 1st of June, by a BVB staff member, and handed over to the committee for further procedures.

Though her parents are still missing, Seema has found a home in the hearts of the many people she has met along the way. The staff of BOSCO Vatsalya Bhavan testify that with guidance and counselling, she had begun to let go of the residual guilt and shame that was left over from her time on the streets. She had left the centre with a new determination to not let anyone or anything drag her back into the same helplessness she had spent an entire childhood fighting.
