She explained a few principles of effective listening such as keeping quiet while listening, accepting the speaker, avoiding distraction, paying attention to ideas and not just words, and keeping an eye out for nonverbal communication. Children were taught how to respond appropriately while developing good listening skills. Thirty-three girls participated in the session.

## **Exposure Visit**



The children of BOSCO Vikas visited VV Puram Police Station on September 28, 2023. The exposure visit was organized in coordination with the BOSCO SJPU Project. He also explained the various issues related to children such as child marriage, child labour, child sexual abuse, child trafficking, etc. The role and activities of the CWPO were also explained to the children. He shared the preventive methods, how they help at-risk children, and the difference between CWC and JJB. Forty-four children and three staff were visited the police station.
