BOSCO Essay Writing Competition 2023-24

BOSCO Bengaluru organized the 6th annual essay writing competition for college and university students from October to January 2023-24. Around 140 colleges/universities from across India were contacted. The undergraduate, graduate, and postgraduate students from various disciplines like management, social work, sociology, media, economics, engineering, law, commerce, psychology, and life sciences participated in the congregation.

This year's competition aimed to create a platform highlighting rarely discussed issues in education, society, and culture, enabling students to explore and challenge predefined mindsets to form their perspectives. Four topics were chosen for the competition – 'The stigma surrounding mental health issues in children: Breaking the silence,' 'Rising incidence of depression among teens – causes and changes that can be made,' 'Increasing gadget dependency and adolescent mental health,' 'Education beyond classrooms: Is alternative education a viable option in India?'

The essays were judged by an external panel of judges on the criteria of Originality of Content, Creativity, Clarity of Expression, Adherence to Theme, and Writing Style, and the first prize was awarded to Bicky

Boro from Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai. The second place was secured by Nethra Aparna from St. Joseph's College of Commerce, Bengaluru, and the third prize was won by Ashwath Chelladurai from the NALSAR University of Law, Hyderabad. The BOSCO Essay Writing Competition 2023-24 culminated on the promise of more profound conviction and honest reflection about issues that need to be brought from behind the shadow of societal prejudice to the forefront of society's consciousness and commitment.
