- Juvenile crime is a serious concern in India, with a growing number of young people engaging in criminal activities. According to the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), the number of juveniles in conflict with the law has increased over the years.
- Broken families, domestic violence, and poor parenting do not offer a safe environment for children (in need of care and protection). Children growing up in such an environment devoid of emotional support and criminal activities provide a sense of belonging. Peer pressure, drug abuse, gang culture, poverty, illiteracy of the parents, and lack of educational opportunities are also significant factors contributing to increased juvenile crime in India. Involvement in criminal activities profoundly impacts young people's productive lives. Guilt, shame, low selfesteem: with family repute at stake and social stigma, these young persons find it difficult to integrate into mainstream society.
 - Effective prevention and intervention strategies need to be in place. Preventing Juvenile Crime in India requires a collaborative effort from families, communities, and government agencies to address the root causes of criminal behavior and provide young people with the support they need to thrive. Investing in prevention and intervention strategies can help young people avoid the devastating consequences of juvenile crime and build brighter futures for themselves and their communities.

AWARENESS PROGRAMS

AWARENESS ON CRIME PREVENTION

BOSCO Special Juvenile Police Unit (SJPU) project conducted awareness programmes on crime prevention in Jolly Moholla and Yarab Nagar communities on May 22, 2024 as it was noticed that a large number of crimes and drug abuse was reported from these localities. Ramaswamy, Coordinator, BOSCO SJPU Project informed the communities about child rights, child related issues, drug menace, children into crimes and dropping out of school.

He cautioned the parents to be alert about their children's deviant behaviour and for any issues like child marriage, child labour, missing cases, etc. call up the child helpline (112). Mr. Hanumanth R.R, Police Constable, and Ms. Shobha G.C, WPC, Cottonpete Police Station were present in the programme at Jolly Moholla and Mr. Prashanth, Police Constable, Ms. Tejashwini and Ms. Eshwari K.M, WPCs, Yarab Nagar Police Station, Banashankari were present in the programme at Yarab Nagar. Forty people from Jolly Mohalla and thirty-five people from Yarab Nagar were part of the awareness sessions.







COLLEGE AWARENESS PROGRAM

BOSCO Foster Care Programme conducted an awareness programme on Foster Care for the students of Bangalore City University on May 15, 2024. Obalesh, Social Mobilizer, BOSCO Foster Care Programme explained about BOSCO, the ten centres of BOSCO, and its programmes for children and young at risk. He explained in detail about the CHILDLINE Programme, SJPU Project, and Foster Care Programme.

He briefed about the foster care concept as mentioned in the Juvenile Justice Act, adoption, the various agencies involved in the programme like DCPU, and CWC, their roles and responsibilities, the legal procedures involved, and the role of various other stakeholders. The students ensured their support of the programme by disseminating the foster care information during their fieldwork in the communities and referring deserving parents and children to the foster care team. Fifty-three students attended the programme.





AWARENESS TO STAKEHOLDERS

Child Safety Net (CSN) Project, BOSCO Bengaluru organized awareness programmes for the BBMP Pourakarmikas in Chandra Layout and the workers of a Bag Factory in Cottonpet, Bengaluru on May 2 and 29, 2024 respectively. The coordinator, PN Basavaraju spoke about child-related issues like sexual abuse, child trafficking, child labour and drug abuse. They requested the support of the stakeholders in identifying children employed, children in difficult situations, and children in conflict with the law in order to provide a safe and happy environment for them. Twenty-six Pourakarmikas and fifteen factory workers attended the sessions.



HEALTH AWARENESS

Health care team in collaboration with St.
Marthas Hospital conducted health awareness session for the children of BOSCO Mane, Vikas and Vatsalya Bhavan at the centre on May 26, 2024. Ms. Uma Rai, Social Worker, St. Marthas Hospital, Bengaluru interacted with the children and spoke about skin infections caused by bacteria, virus, fungus, parasites, etc. and the symptoms like redness, warmth, swelling, tenderness of the skin, and boils or blisters.

She cautioned not share personal items with others like the clothes, combs, towels, etc. St. Martha's College of Nursing Students performed a small skit regarding cleanliness. The children of BOSCO Mane, Vikas and Vatsalya Bhavan attended the session.



PUBLIC AWARENESS PROGRAM



BOSCO teams working in BMTC and KSRTC bus stand, Adjacent Railway Street Presence (ARSP) project, BOSCO Yuvakendra, BOSCO Nilaya and Nivas conducted awareness for the public, passengers and the commuters, shopkeepers, in the bus stands, railway stations and market areas during May 2024.

The teams reached out to the public by way of distributing pamphlets containing information on child rights, child-related laws, and acts, and issues such as child labour, child marriage, child trafficking, child begging, missing children, child runaways, vulnerable children, and child helpline-1098. More than a thousand passengers, commuters, shop keepers, and other public benefitted from the awareness.



MEETINGS

ADOLESCENT GIRLS' MEETING

BOSCO Nivas had a meeting with the adolescent girls of Rajiv Gandhi Colony on May 12, 2024 to create awareness on personal hygiene and peer group influence. The team gave information about personal hygiene, menstrual hygiene, consuming nutritious food, drinking water frequently. The team also shed light on the peer group influence, care to be taken while choosing friends and not falling a prey to drugs/substance abuse. The team highlighted the importance of education to make a good career. Twenty-five girls attended the meeting.

BOSCO Nilaya organized a meeting with the adolescent girls at the centre on May 18, 2024. Bhagyalakshmi, Social Mobilizer, BOSCO Nilaya explained about personal safety, safe and unsafe touch, hygiene, cyber safety, mobile addiction and drug addiction. She also spoke about following a good food pattern and a healthy life style. Thirty girls participated in the meeting.



PARENTS MEETING AT BOSCO YUVAKENDRA

BOSCO Yuvakendra organized a meeting for the parents of the youth on May 14, 2024. Sr. Silvy, Director, BOSCO Yuvakendra, spoke about the activities of the centre and how the youths are engaged in different tasks throughout the day. She also spoke about the talent enhancement activities and the care and safe environment provided to their wards at the centre. Ms. Geethamala, Counsellor, BOSCO Yuvakendra, addressed the parents and sought their support in returning the youths to mainstream society.

The parents said they were happy to see noticeable changes in their wards' behaviours, mannerisms, attitudes and communication. The youth staged cultural programmes. Mr. Sathish ASI, Mr. Sritesh, Head Constable and Mr. Kempanna, PC, KP Agrahara Police Station and Fr. Dominic, Salesian In-charge, BOSCO Yuvakendra, were present in the meeting. Nineteen youths and sixteen parents attended the meeting.









HEALTH CAMP

BOSCO Yuvodaya in collaboration with BOSCO Health Care Department organized a health camp for the children of the Open Shelter on May 23, 2024. Dr. Abraham M.D., Senior Consultant, St.Martha's Hospital, Bengaluru and his team conducted the camp. He checked the height, weight, BP and the overall health of the children. He referred two boys to a dermatologist for further medical intervention. He advised the children to have nutritious food and avoid junk foods. Forty-five children availed the services of the camp.

BOSCO Health Care Department held eye screening camps on the request of BOSCO Rainbow Home, Nilaya and Nivas for the center children and people of Vinobha Nagar and Sagayapuram respectively, in association with The Eye Foundation, Bengaluru and Retina Institute of Karnataka on May 26, 27 and 31, 2024. Thirteen children and two staff from Rainbow Home were asked for further follow up by The Eye Foundation team. Dr. Supreeth and team, Retina Institute of Karnataka did the eye screening and referred people of Vinobha Nagar for further check-up to their hospital. The team also gave them an awareness of eye care and the precautionary measures to be taken to maintain eye health. Forty children and ten staff from Rainbow Home and fifty children, fifty-one adults from Vinobha Nagar and more than hundred and fifty people form Sagayapuram attended the camps.
