KANNADA RAJYOTSAVA

BOSCO Vikas, Mane, Rainbow Home, Yuvodaya and Nivas celebrated Kannada Rajyotsava with the centre children and at Shivaji Nagar Bus Stand with the BMTC officials and Police Officials on November 1, 2024.

The day started with garlanding the photos of the famous Kannada poets who were Jnanapeeth Awardees and prominent Kannada leaders and actors. Karnataka flag was hoisted. Directors' message for the children included the importance of learning Kannada language and embracing the culture and language of Karnataka. After the message, the Karnataka State Anthem was sung, followed by the National Anthem. Sweets were distributed to the children.





EYE SCREENING CAMPS

BOSCO Health Care Department and Gandhi Nagar Team in collaboration with Shraddha Eye Care Trust conducted free eve check up and cataract surgery camp at Annamma colony for the children attending tuition classes and the community people on November 24, 2024. Dr. Vittal and Dr. Ajay conducted the camp. Seven community members were referred for cataract surgery following the eye check-ups, twelve community members were given community reading glasses, forty members underwent a general eye check-up and eight community members were referred to eye hospital further medical attention. Fr. Varghese Pallipuram, Executive Director, BOSCO Bengaluru was present in the camp. A total of seventy-six community people and children availed the services of the camp.



CSN Team and BOSCO Health Care Department organized an eye camp for the tuition children and GHPS children of Veerabhadragudda on November 26, 2024. The camp was conducted by The Eye Foundation, Bengaluru. Four children were referred for further check up and treatment. A total of hundred and twelve children, four parents and three school staff were benefited by the eye camp.

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CHILD RIGHTS WEEK







BOSCO CSN project, BOSCO CRISP project, BOSCO Bus Stand Team, ARSP, BOSCO Nilaya, Nivas, Yuvakendra, Yuvodaya, Sumanahalli, Rainbow Home, Vatsalya Bhavan, Vikas, and Mane, began the Child Rights Week with the celebration of Children's Day at their respective areas and centres on November 14, 2024. The Centre Directors, Department Officials, stakeholders, and staff members participated in the programme. The team gave awareness about Children's Day, UNCRC, child rights, acts, and laws.

During the week from November 14 to 20, 2024, awareness campaigns were held in public places, bus stands, communities, schools, Government Boys Home, etc., and stakeholders' meetings, adolescent girls' meetings, parents' meetings, mime show at Orion Mall, Mantri Mall, rallies, tying of child rights bands to the BMTC and KSRTC Officials, Police Officials, other stakeholders and children and distribution of pamphlets to the public were also conducted. Children were given Nehru caps in memory of Chacha Nehru. The week-long programme included group discussions, essay, drawing, speech, pick and speak, dance, and quiz competitions based on the theme, 'Family is Where I Belong'. Children of BOSCO Yuvodaya were given note books with their respective photos on them.

As a culmination of Child Rights Week, NIVAS team organized a signature campaign at Vishwesharaiah Museum on November 20, 2024. Fr. Varghese Pallipuram, Executive Director, BOSCO Bengaluru and Mr. Sajoo Bhaskaran, ED, Vishwesharaiah Museum, kick-started the event with their assent. More than 1500 children from various schools all across Karnataka were given awareness on the RIGHTS concerning them. Mr. Kotresh - Police Inspector, Banashankari Police Station, BMTC officials were present during the campaigns. Around two thousand children, Government Officials, Stakeholders, and the public were reached out to through the week-long programme.







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CHILDREN'S DAY CELEBRATION AT BOSCO BENGALURU

BOSCO Bengaluru organized Children's Day celebration at BOSCO Life Skill Training Centre, Sumanahalli, Bengaluru, on November 17, 2024. This year's Children's Day celebration was based on the theme, 'Family is Where I Belong'. Smt. Umashree, Former Minister for Women and Child Development, Empowerment of the Differently-abled and Senior Citizens, Kannada Language and Culture, and Actor, Kannada Film Industry, addressing the children said, "BOSCO is working for the welfare underprivileged children for more than forty years. I would like to convey my best wishes to the BOSCO family".
